## **What is your academic background?**

## **What are the total fees of your course?**

## **1. Why have you selected this University?**

Also, the student satisfaction ratio is 91% that shows students are happy and satisfied while studying at the university of Law. Our practical degrees have a real-world focus that prepares you for a professional career.

One of the most important reasons for selecting this university is location, it is located in the centre of London and London is multicultural and it is also a hub of education. It will give me easy access to accommodation, laundry services and government services like transportation, health services.

## **3. Have you compared this University with other Universities?**

Yes, I compared the University of Law with the University of East London and Middlesex University before making my final decision.

- The student satisfaction rate of the **University of East London** is around **85%** and **Middlesex University** is around **82%**, whereas **the University of Law** has a satisfaction rate of **91%**. This shows that students are very satisfied with the teaching and support provided by the University of Law.
- The University of East London offers modules such as Wireless Signal Propagation and Hardware Security, while Middlesex University offers Network and Information Security and Data Science. In comparison, the University of Law offers Applications of Artificial Intelligence and Data Management Technologies, which match my interests and career goals in the computing field.
- The tuition fee at the University of East London is approximately £16,800, while Middlesex University charges around £18,000. The University of Law charges around £17,500, which I found to be a reasonable cost for the quality of education and support offered.
- After comparing the student satisfaction rates, course modules, and tuition fees, I found that the University of Law offers the best overall package for my academic and career goals, which is why I chose it for my MSc Computer Science studies.

#### **4.What are your course modules?**

- g. MSc Project in Computer Science - 60 credits**

#### **5. Have you compared the UK with other countries?**

Yes, I have compared the United Kingdom with other countries like Australia, United States, and Canada.

In Australia, tuition fees are around AUD 20,000 to AUD 40,000 per year, and living expenses are about AUD 18,000 to AUD 30,000, especially in cities like Sydney and Melbourne, making it quite expensive.

In the United States and Canada, tuition fees range from \$25,000 to \$50,000 USD and CAD 10,000 to CAD 60,000 respectively, with high living costs. Also, most master's programs are two years long, which increases the overall cost.

**In addition, many universities in the USA ask for exams like GRE or GMAT during admission, while UK universities mainly focus on academic performance and**

**the overall student profile, making the admission process simpler and more convenient.**

In the UK, tuition fees are comparatively lower, around £16,000 to £20,000, and living expenses are about £9,000 to £11,000 per year. Additionally, most master's programs are completed in one year.

Overall, the UK offers a better balance of quality education, shorter duration, easier admission process, and more affordable total cost, making it the best choice for me.

## **6. Why Not India? \ How is this course different from what you can study in your home country.**

I have selected the United Kingdom over India because the UK education system is more practical, career-focused, and globally recognized. While India has strong institutions, many master's programs are more theory-based, whereas the UK emphasizes real-world learning, case studies, and industry-relevant skills. **The teacher-student ratio is also better in the UK around 15:1, compared to 50:1 in India so students get more guidance and personalized attention.**

Another key factor is class size, as UK universities offer smaller classes with better interaction and personalized guidance, which is often limited in India. The course duration is also shorter, with most UK master's programs completed in one year compared to two years in India, this allows me to save both time and cost. **UK universities teach fully in English and focus more on practical and updated learning. In India, education is often more focused on marks, exams, and competition, so students may get fewer practical learning opportunities.**

**Studying in the UK also gives me an international environment where I can meet students from different countries and learn about different cultures. The UK has modern and student-friendly cities, and many universities also provide scholarship opportunities from universities, the government, and private organisations, which helps students financially.**

Overall, the UK offers practical learning, global exposure, personal support from teachers, shorter courses, and internationally recognised degrees. Therefore, considering these factors, I believe the UK is the best choice for my higher studies and future career.

The accommodation is about 0.8 miles from the university campus and take around 10 Minute's to reach.

I will mainly travel to the university by walking.

## **Maintenance cost and living expenses in the UK?**

My estimated living expenses in the UK are based on official UKVI guidelines. The required maintenance cost for inside London is £1,529 per month and for 9 months is £13,761.

My estimated monthly expenses would include around 850 for accommodation, 200 for food and groceries, 100 for transportation, 100 for mobile and internet, 120 for study materials, and around 150 for personal and miscellaneous expenses.

I would also keep additional funds for emergency expenses during my stay in the UK.

### **Who is going to sponsor you? / How will you manage your expenses?**

My father is going to sponsor me, He is a businessman, we have a tailoring shop from where he has a yearly income of 12-15 lakhs, and with that he also has savings up to 10 lakh which is enough to cover my tuition fees and living expense.

I don't have any work intention in UK as I just want to focus on my studies and want to be skilled in my field.

### **What is the level of your course?**

My course is a Level 7 qualification, which is a Postgraduate Master's degree under the NQF Level 7 framework.

### **How will you travel to the university every day?**

I plan to travel to the university using public transport, mainly bus and train, as the UK has a well-connected and reliable transport system. I plan to choose accommodation within 20–30 minutes of the campus, which makes daily commuting convenient.

Each single journey will cost approximately £2 to £5, and my monthly travel expense will be around £150 to £180.

If I choose accommodation very close to the campus, I can also walk to the university, which will help me save both time and travel costs.
