## **SPORTS TRY-OUT FOR THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES' REPRESENTATION IN THE UNIVERSITY DAY**

By enacting this standardized system, we achieve three vital goals: We ensure that the absolute most deserving student-athletes wear our college colors; We democratize the field, offering an equal, uncompromised opportunity for every single CAS student to showcase their grit and skill.; We preserve the absolute integrity and competitive edge of our College in alignment with university-wide standards.

To guarantee that fairness is not just promised but practiced, the entire tryout and selection procedure will be rigorously supervised by the **Committee for Sports, Coaches, and Board Members**. Accountability is woven into the very fabric of this initiative through a meticulous timeline—spanning from the initial registration drive to the final deliberation. Every evaluation standard, every administrative role, and every monitoring mechanism is clearly mapped out.

To execute a professional-grade selection process that values the dignity of our athletes, coaches, and organizers, we have drafted a lean, fully transparent budget of **₱12,000.00**. ## Sponsorship Speech for Resolution No. 00, s. 2026-2027 (Prowl to Progress)

Mr. Presiding Officer, esteemed colleagues of the Provincial Board. This representation rises in support of Resolution No. \_\_, s. 2026-2027, which requests the release of Ten Thousand Pesos (₱10,000.00) as budget allocation for the implementation of "Prowl to Progress" during the LGU Freshmen Orientation for the College of Arts and Sciences for the Academic Year 2026-2027. This initiative, jointly implemented by the Ministry of Academics and the Ministry of Organizations, is designed as a dedicated thirty-minute segment within the broader orientation program, adopting a holistic approach to student development. Its primary goal is to foster resilience, ensure a balanced university experience, and proactively safeguard freshmen from academic burnout—challenges that are increasingly prevalent among new college students. By enlisting subject-matter experts and qualified resource speakers, the program will equip freshmen with practical strategies across three critical areas: College Survival and Navigation, Academic Productivity, and Workload Management and Well-being. The insights, advice, and techniques shared during this session are intended to serve as a sustainable reference guide for students throughout their entire first year, empowering them to navigate the demands of higher education with confidence and competence.

The requested amount of Ten Thousand Pesos has been carefully and transparently allocated to cover the essential requirements for the successful implementation of Prowl to Progress. The budget breakdown includes honoraria amounting to 1,500 each totaling to 3,000 pesos and tokens amounting to 1,000 each totaling to 2,000 pesos for the two guest speakers, as well as the production of guiding pamphlets to be distributed to all freshmen attendees costing 7.50 pesos multiplied by 500 totaling to 3,800 pesos, ensuring that the lessons imparted during the session are retained and accessible for future reference. A contingency fund of 1,200 pesos has also been set aside to address any unforeseen expenses. This allocation guarantees the efficient delivery of a well-organized and meaningful program that complements the overall LGU Freshmen Orientation. It is therefore respectfully urged that this resolution be approved, affirming the commitment of the Province of Arts and Sciences Student Council and the College administration to provide freshmen with the necessary tools and support for a successful and fulfilling college experience.

## **Sponsorship Speech for Resolution No. \_\_, s. 2026-2027 (Bata, Alaga Ka: Promoting Health, Hygiene, and Care in the Community)**

Mr. Presiding Officer, esteemed colleagues of the Provincial Board. This representation rises in support of Resolution No. \_\_, s. 2026-2027, which requests the release of Fourteen Thousand Pesos (₱14,000.00) as budget allocation for the outreach program entitled "Bata, Alaga Ka: Promoting Health, Hygiene, and Care in the Community," to be implemented at Culasi Elementary School for the Academic Year 2026-2027. This initiative, spearheaded by the Province of Arts and Sciences Student Council through the Ministry of External Affairs, reflects the unwavering commitment of the College to community engagement, youth empowerment, and social responsibility. The program specifically targets Grade 4 pupils and their parents from the adopted community of Central Philippine University, aiming to educate them on proper hygiene, preventive healthcare, healthy daily habits, and community wellness practices. In an era where children are increasingly exposed to unhealthy lifestyle patterns—including poor eating habits, excessive screen time, and limited physical activity—this outreach program serves as a timely and necessary intervention to prevent illnesses, encourage self-care, and foster healthier lifestyles. Furthermore, the program seeks to strengthen parental awareness on the importance of supervising and reinforcing proper hygiene practices at home, recognizing that family involvement is crucial in sustaining these healthy behaviors beyond the classroom.

The requested amount of Fourteen Thousand Pesos has been carefully and transparently allocated to cover all essential components of the outreach program. The budget breakdown includes the procurement of hygiene kits for 74 pupils, food and beverages for 90 participants, a tarpaulin for program visibility, vellum board, certificate holders, and an honorarium for the resource speaker. A contingency fund has also been set aside to address any unforeseen expenses. This allocation guarantees the successful and meaningful implementation of the program, ensuring that the adopted community receives the full benefit of this health promotion initiative. It is therefore respectfully urged that this resolution be approved, affirming the commitment of the Province of Arts and Sciences Student Council and the College administration to extend its reach beyond the campus and contribute to the holistic development of the broader community—one child, one family, and one barangay at a time.
